

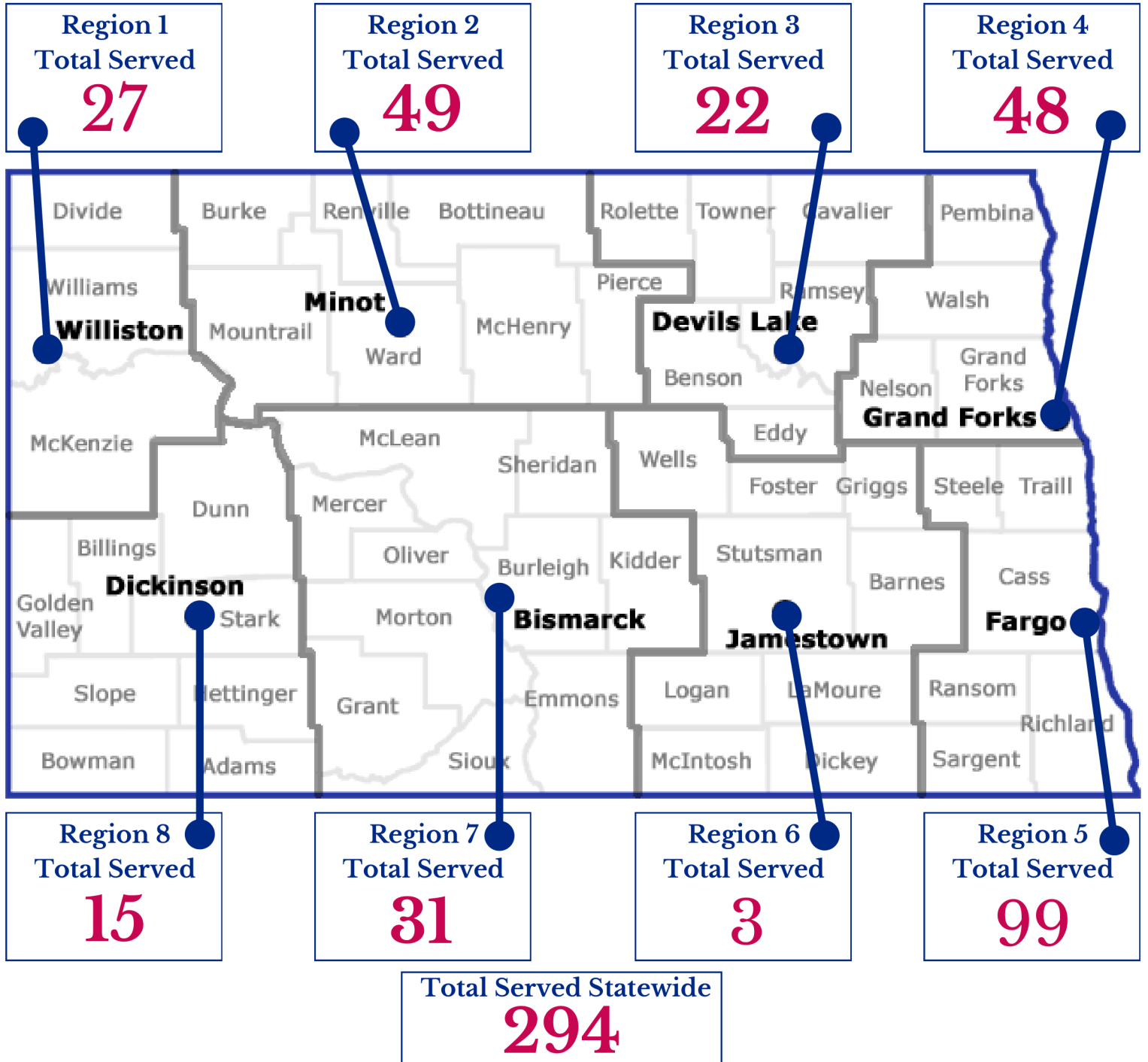


ND SSVF By The Numbers

The Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) program was started in 2008 and has grown to cover the majority of the United States. The program came to North Dakota in 2012 with the goal of promoting stability among very low-income veteran families. SSVF supports a Housing First approach to help veteran families meet their primary need of housing while addressing barriers to housing stability.

* Homeless prevention (HP) assistance is provided to those who are at imminent risk of becoming literally homeless to help them remain housed.

**Rapid re-housing (RRH) is an intervention designed to help participants quickly exit homelessness by returning them directly to permanent housing.

Temporary Financial Assistance

Temporary Financial Assistance (TFA) is provided to participants of the SSVF program. TFA can be used to pay for expenses that support housing stability like transportation expenses, security deposits, childcare, emergency housing assistance, utility fee assistance, rental assistance, other general housing stability activities.

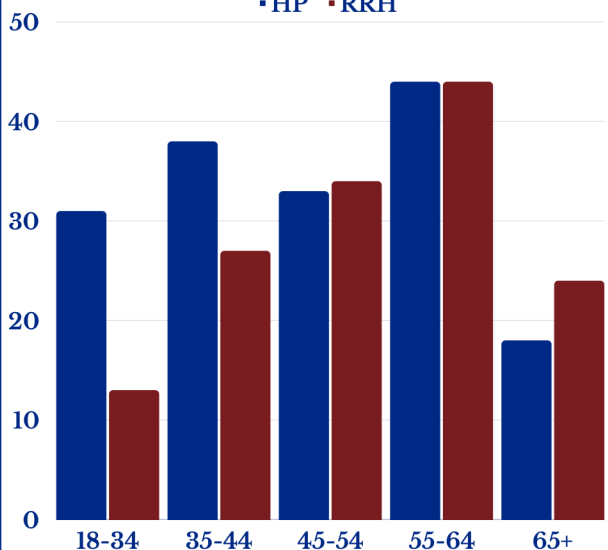

Shallow Subsidy

The SSVF Program office implemented a new rental subsidy arrangement called, Shallow Subsidy, which provides rental payments on behalf of low-income Veteran households who are enrolled in SSVF rapid rehousing or homeless prevention services. The rental assistance is set at a fixed rate every month, regardless of changes in the Veteran household's income or monthly rent amount. The maximum amount of the rental subsidy is up to 50% of rent.
